School

Kahlotus School District is a K-12 facility. Preschool is also offered to children ages 3-5 at no cost to families. Enrollment averages 50 students with 30 of those students attending the Elementary School (pre-k through 6th Grade) and 20 students attending the Jr/Sr High School (7th-12th Grades). The district employs 10 certified staff, 8 classified staff and 3 administrative staff members.

Students can enjoy small class sizes and be involved in multiple activities and clubs throughout the year. Kahlotus participates in an athletic co-op with local schools and students have a variety of sports options throughout the year.

Transportation is provided. Opportunities for student employment (lifeguards and facility maintenance) are available in the summer months.
